## **RULES OF ORDER FOR THE CONDUCT OF CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS**

(Resolution No.10928 (CCS))

Persons wishing to address the City Council regarding items on the agenda must be present and submit their name and address (optional) in writing to the City Clerk **before the public hearing is opened for that item.** Request-to-Speak forms are available prior to the meeting and throughout the meeting. Remarks from the public are limited to a total of 6 minutes per Council meeting, with a maximum of 2 minutes and a minimum of one minute per item. Except for the author of the request, public comment on 12-items are limited to 1 minute. Except on Public Input, speakers may donate 2 minutes to another person who may speak for a total of 4 minutes on that item. Both the donor of time and the designated speaker must submit their cards in person together.

**Members of the audience:** Please refrain from clapping, whistling, or acts of disorderly conduct; do not distribute literature without prior authorization of the presiding officer; remain seated unless addressing the City Council; do not stand or sit in aisles; do not enter the well area of the dais or go behind rails unless authorized by the presiding officer.

### **3.A. Property Insurance Brokerage Services**

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that the City Council:

- 1. Award RFP #92 to Alliant Insurance Services, Inc., a California-based company, for property insurance brokerage services; and

**3.D. Bid Award for the Purchase of 18 Nissan Leaf Electric Vehicles**

**Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that the City Council:

1. Award Bid #4258 to Nissan of Stockton, a Yokohama, Japan-based company, for the purchase and delivery of 14 Nissan Leaf Electric Vehicles with the option to purchase up to four additional Nissan Leaf Electric Vehicles over a two year period;
2. Authorize the Purchasing Services Manager to issue a purchase order with Nissan of Stockton for the purchase and delivery of 14 Nissan Leaf Electric Vehicles in an amount not to exceed \$403,950 for year one, with one additional one-year renewal option in the amount of \$115,415, for a total amount not to exceed \$519,365.

**Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that the City Council authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute a one-year Memorandum of Understanding with the Main Street Business Improvement Association to co-produce the 2017 Summer SOULstice event.

**3.F. Modification to Gafcon Contract for Citywide Prevailing Wage and Labor Compliance**

**Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that the City Council authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute a first modification to Agreement #3142 in the amount of \$220,000 with Gafcon, Inc., a California-based company, to provide citywide labor compliance and certified payroll monitoring on an as-needed basis. This will result in a three-year amended agreement with a new total amount not to exceed \$300,000, with future year funding contingent on Council budget approval.

**3.G. Third Modification to Saddle Peak Antenna Site Lease Agreement**

**Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that City Council authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute a third modification to agreement #8377 in the amount of \$300,000 with American Tower Corporation, a Delaware-based company, for antenna site lease. This would result in a five-year amended agreement with a new total contract

amount not to exceed \$798,828, with future year funding contingent on Council budget approval.

**3.H. Award of Feasibility/Design-Build Contract to shorten the runway at Santa Monica Municipal Airport (SMO) to 3,500 feet per Consent Decree between the City and FAA.**

**Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that the City Council:

1. Award RFP# 2500 to AECOM/Aeroplex, a California-based company, an engineering consultant for reducing Runway 03-21 at Santa Monica Municipal Airport (SMO) to 3,500 feet per consent decree between the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the City of Santa Monica.
2. Authorize the City Manager to negotiate and execute a feasibility/design-build agreement with AECOM/Aeroplex, in an amount not to exceed \$879,741 (including a 10% contingency).

**Recommended Action**

**Recommended Action**

Staff recommends that the Council adopt the attached resolution adopting three measures to implement the February 1 Consent Decree with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and the Federal Government regarding Santa Monica Airport (SMO):

1. The City Council directs the City Manager, City Attorney and their staffs to take all actions necessary and proper to ensure that SMO will cease to operate as an airport and shall be closed to all aeronautical use forever effective as of midnight on December 31, 2028.

2. The City Council directs the City Manager not to enter into any agreements with the FAA, or any other party, that may have the effect of requiring the City to continue to operate SMO after December 31, 2028.
3. The City Council directs the City Manager to ensure that the City provides 30-day prior notice to the FAA of the City's intent to initiate shortening of SMO's runway to an operational length of 3500 feet at the earliest feasible opportunity.
